No uninspected meat or product and no inspected and passed meat or product, which is known to have become unsound, unhealthful, unwholesome, or in any way unfit for human food, including any rendered or unrendered inedible grease, inedible tallow- or other inedible fat from the carcasses of cattle, sheep, swine, or goats and possessing the physical characteristics of an edible product, shall be transported from one State or Territory or the District of Columbia to or through another State or Territory or the District of Columbia, or to any place under the jurisdiction of the United States, or to a foreign country, for industrial use, unless it is first denatured or otherwise destroyed for food purposes. The shipper shall not offer nor the carrier accept for interstate or foreign transportation any such article until it has been denatured or otherwise destroyed for food purposes as required by this section. This certificate shall be separate and apart from any way-bill, bill of lading or other form ordinarily used in the transportation of meat. The duplicate certi- ficate shall be forwarded immediately by the initial car- rier to the Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry, Washington, D. 9 (Con.)	●	9- 6-17	Change	<p>As evidence to connecting carriers that the proper shipper's certi- ficate is on file with the initial carrier, the way-bills, transfer bills, running slips or conductor's cards accompanying such shipments shall have embodied therein, stamped thereon or attached thereto a signed state- ment in the following form:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">(Name of transportation company.)</p> <p>Unsound, unwholesome or otherwise unfit for food, and de- natured or otherwise rendered unavailable for food purposes, as evidenced by shipper's certificate on file with initial carrier. (Signed).....Agent.</p> <p>The signature of the agent shall be written in full.</p> <p>"14b. In case of wreck or other extraordinary emergency, the Government seals may be broken, and contents of car diverted or reload- ed without another shipper's certificate, but in such cases full information concerning the original shipment and change of destination or reloading must be promptly forwarded to the Division Superintendent for trans- mission by telegraph to the Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry, Washington, D. C., as per Paragraph 2 of Section 14 of Regulation 25.</p> <p>When cars containing inspected and passed meats or meat food pro- ducts are received from connecting lines with inspection seals missing, broken or not in perfect condition, immediate report must be made to Division Superintendent for transmission by wire to Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry, Washington, D. C., advising as follows:</p> <p>(a) Number and initials of car. (b) Date and name of road from which received. (c) Originating point of shipment and destination. (d) Kind and amount of product. (e) Number or symbol of railroad seals applied.</p> <p>When reports are made to Division Superintendent, notation must be made on way-bills and slip bills: "B. A. I. notified (date)" to obviate duplication of advice by others."</p>
