## GOING SOMEWHERE? CHECK YOUR TIMETABLE!

Your New York Central timetable has the travel tips to make your trip easier—and more fun, too. Just as your Central train takes you into the heart of the city of your choice, the timetable gives you inside information about schedules, fares, and many of our special passenger services.

### TRAINS AND STATIONS

On page 9 you'll find a list of stations served by the Central passenger fleet, together with the number of the particular table showing Central train service to each one. (Remember: the number indicates the table, not the page. Look in the upper left hand corner of individual table for its number.)

**TIMETABLE TIPS**—Once you've found your particular table, read down the column of stations until you find your point of departure and your destination. Follow across the page and you'll find the time that trains arrive and leave. Remember that *light* figures indicate 12:01 am to noon; *dark* figures, 12:01 pm to midnight.

**DINERS AND SLEEPERS**—On pages 10 and 11 you'll find your train listed by its number and name, with a description of its equipment—coaches, sleepercoaches and sleepers, diners and lounges. Trains not shown in this listing carry coaches only.

**WHAT'S THE FARE?**—Fares between major points, found on pages 12 and 13, gives you rates for both thrifty coach and deluxe sleeping car accommodations. Incidentally, special reduced fares for groups and families are available on the Central. Page 13 will give you more information, and your Central ticket or passenger agent will be glad to help with your specific travel needs.

**OTHER TIMETABLE TIDBITS**—Central railroaders call this timetable the "thousand-and-one", and you'll find almost as many tips between its covers: a map of the 10,000-mile New York Central system on back cover, names, addresses and telephone numbers of passenger and freight representatives in key cities on page 14 and 15, and many useful hints on baggage regulation, optional routings, reservations and many others under "General Information" on page 16.

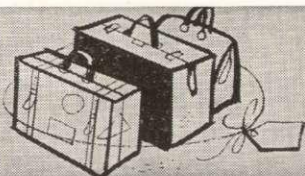

## GENERAL INFORMATION



### TICKETS AND FARES

**Purchase in Advance.** Please buy tickets before boarding trains and avoid payment of extra charge.

**Adjustment of Fares.** Should any misunderstanding arise with conductors or ticket agents, pay the fare requested, secure a receipt and send it to address shown under "Redemption of Tickets."

**Redemption of Tickets.** Unused or partially used tickets of all classes will be redeemed under tariff regulations at proper value, less service charge, where applicable. Communicate with Mr. J. D. Ryan—A.P.R., New York Central System, Michigan Central Terminal, Detroit, Michigan 48216.

**Loss of Tickets.** Passenger should guard against such loss, as railroads are not responsible.

**Children.** Under five years of age, free, when accompanied by parent or guardian; 5 years of age and under 12, one-half fare; 12 years of age and over, full fare. Important additional savings possible in one-way and round-trip travel under Family Plan described on page 13.

**Restrictions on Reduced Fare Tickets.** Tickets bearing endorsements such as Charity, DVS, VAH or Blind and Attendant, *will not* be honored on Twentieth Century Limited—(25 and 26) in standard sleeping cars; but *will* be honored in Sleepercoach and reserved seat coach. Group Economy Tickets *will not* be honored in Sleepercoaches.

**Stopovers.** Stopovers are permitted at any point en route within limit of ticket.

**Optional Honoring Via Pennsylvania R.R.** All round trip tickets reading in both directions via either New York Central or Pennsylvania between the cities listed below may be used in one direction over the Central and in the other direction over the Pennsylvania without additional cost.

### RESERVATIONS—SLEEPING OR PARLOR CAR & COACH

**Purchase in Advance.** Tickets for reserved Sleeping or Parlor car space and coach seats should be purchased as far in advance as possible.

**Cancellations.** If you change your travel plans, please cancel Sleeping or Parlor car or coach reservations promptly by telephone.

**Refund of Sleeping Car and Sleepercoach Tickets.** To obtain full refund, less service charge, space must be canceled not later than day before train departure, or two days before if train departs between midnight and 5:00 A.M. Where space is canceled on day of departure, more than four hours before train time, a late cancellation charge of 50% of space charge will be assessed. No refund will be allowed when space is canceled within four hours of train time. Apply to ticket agent.

**Refund of Parlor Car Seat Tickets and Reserved Coach Seat Tickets.** Tickets sold before date of departure are redeemable only if space is canceled on or before day prior to departure date. Tickets sold on date of departure are redeemable only if space is canceled three hours prior to departure of train.

### BAGGAGE

*Liberal Baggage privileges are a feature of N.Y.C. Passenger Service*

**Baggage Defined.** Personal baggage consists of wearing apparel, toilet articles (except liquids) and personal effects necessary for comfort and convenience. Money, jewelry, silverware, negotiable papers, fragile or perishable articles, radios and household goods are not checkable baggage.

**Check Baggage Direct.** Free yourself of unneeded luggage while en route. Check your baggage through to home address, hotel, steamship dock, etc., at destination. Reliable transfer companies perform the service at nominal charges. Charges may be paid at starting point or at destination.

**Baggage Checking Allowance and Service Charge.** All baggage checked subject to tariff regulations. 150 pounds will be transported on full-fare ticket and 75 pounds on half-fare ticket, except a service charge of 35c for each suitcase or other piece of hand baggage and 75c for each trunk will be made at time of checking. No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight or exceeding \$2500.00 in value will be checked.

**Forwarding and Arrival of Baggage.** Passengers are urged to check baggage in advance so that it may be forwarded on a preceding train. Every effort will be made to speed handling but the railroad cannot guarantee the forwarding of baggage on the same train with owner.

**Baggage Insurance.** St. Paul Fire and Marine baggage insurance available in all states except Ohio. See baggage or ticket agent for particulars.

**Miscellaneous.** Dogs, small household pets, baby carriages, bicycles and club paraphernalia may be transported in baggage cars in accordance with tariff regulations. In addition, small dogs, cats, and other household pets in containers, are permitted in coaches (not reserved seat coaches) but cannot occupy a seat or cause annoyance to passengers. Consult baggage or ticket agent.

### MISCELLANEOUS

**The Time.** From 12:01 A.M. to 12:00 o'clock noon, inclusive, is shown in light-face type, between 12:01 P.M. and 12:00 o'clock midnight by dark-face type.

**Regarding Time Tables.** While every precaution is taken, the New York Central is not responsible for errors in time tables, inconveniences or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connections. Train schedules and equipment assigned to trains are subject to change without notice.

**Meeting Friends.** It is always helpful to friends who plan to meet you to know the train number or name, also the number or designation of the Sleeping or Parlor car or coach in which you have a reservation. The Information Bureau in larger stations is the ideal meeting place.
